## WH & S Training for School Cleaners and Schools Officers

During 2017, the Organisational Safety and Wellbeing unit developed a range of safety videos for School Cleaners. The purpose of these videos is to promote awareness of safe work practices, in order to minimise workplace injuries. Topics addressed in these videos include the main mechanisms and

types of workplace injuries being sustained by cleaners. Each of the eight videos is less than 2 minutes long and were developed in consultation with an Occupational Therapist and Infrastructure Services Branch. They can be accessed through OnePortal and cover the topics listed below:

- Warm Up and Stretches (supported by the Daily Stretches for Cleaners Poster)
- Slips and Trips
- Falls
- Using Your Arms Safely
- Using Your Legs Safely
- Using a Leaf Blower
- Vacuuming
- Waste Removal

The videos can be shown to School Cleaners as part of local inductions and for refresher training. The videos can also be shown to injured staff participating in workplace rehabilitation, to support their safe and sustainable return to work. A Health, Safety and Wellbeing Induction for Cleaners package will be developed to incorporate these videos, and provide further context and content.

The Daily Stretches for Cleaners Poster can be displayed in schools as a reminder for cleaners to warm-up and stretch before each shift. Daily warm up and stretching before work physically prepares the human body for work and can prevent workplace injury. Distribution of colour A3 posters to each school commenced during Term 4, 2017 and will continue into Term 1, 2018.

The unit has commenced work on developing additional risk-informed training materials and resources to support School Cleaners and also Schools Officers. As you are aware, these roles sustain the highest rates of workplace injury, WorkCover claims and related absences.

The planned approach involves:

- Occupation level risk assessments of the key work activities required of School Cleaners and Schools Officers
- A training needs analysis on each role
- A gap analysis of training needs and existing training programs/information resources
- Documenting a program of work that clearly articulates the training and support resources that need to be developed
- Development of prioritised risk based training and support materials
- Consultation with key stakeholders to refine the training and materials
- Delivery of risk based training for School Cleaners and Schools Officers

We have completed the occupation level risk assessment process. Consultation has been undertaken with Infrastructure Services Branch regarding the School Cleaner risk assessment. Workshops have been held with regional Health and Safety

Consultant representatives regarding the Schools Officer risk assessment. Discussions have also commenced and been ongoing with the SBMAQ, Together union and United Voice union. We are currently working on the procurement process to engage technical experts, for the training needs analysis and content development work.

In previous years, the annual training program for School Cleaners commenced during the Easter school holidays. As a result of this comprehensive piece of work, the training for cleaners is expected to commence during the July 2018 school holidays.




Groups with arrows next to them indicate that there are sub-groups which you can join.
